Book for the Winter

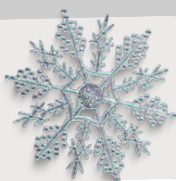

Provide paper and collage materials. Draw what you imagine snow sounds like or how snow looks and feels. Create a picture of a snowy day. Use words like fluffy, soft, cold and icy.



Ice Experiment



Fill a bowl with water and freeze overnight. Let your child explore the ice. Use kitchen tools to break the ice. Freeze small plastic animals in the ice. Can your child free the animals from their icy prison?
