

What an amazing experience for our Early Years children!







#### **Childcare Choices**

Changes to childcare support mean you might now be eligible for more help than ever before.

Support from Childcare Choices can give your child a great start while giving you work choices. From this September, 15 hours childcare for working families with children under 3 will expand to 30 hours, meaning eligible working families can now apply for 30 hours of childcare from the term after their child turns 9 months until they reach school age.
