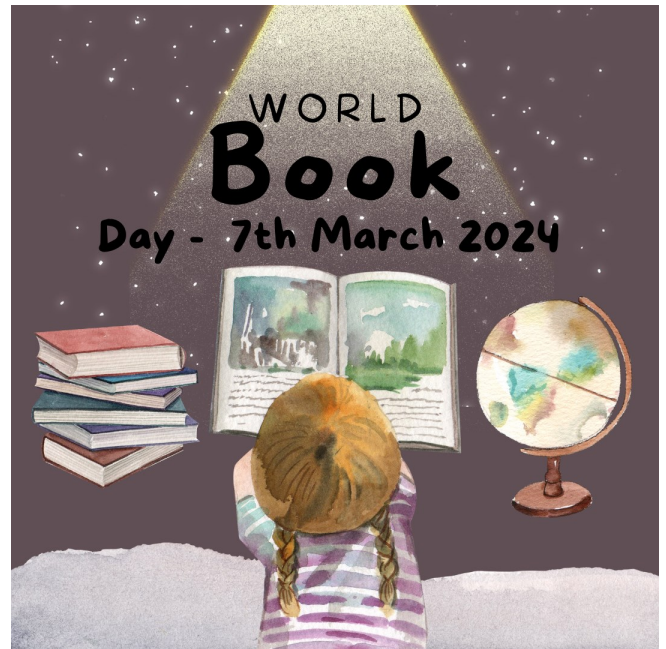

Tips for Reading with Young Children

Babies love to put everything in their mouth. Board books, cloth books, and vinyl books work best for this age.

Make reading part of your daily routine. You might share a favourite book before nap or bedtime.

As your child develops language start asking questions like, "Can you find the cat?" Questioning encourages your child to interact with the text.

You will also start to notice that your child has a strong preference for certain books. Even though you may be tired of reading the same book 100s of times, your child is delighting in the comfort and familiarity that books bring!
