

Book for the Autumn

This is a story about Cat, Duck, and Squirrel, who live deep in the woods in an old white cabin. Everyone has their own jobs to do when they cook. But mayhem ensues when Duck wants to stir the pumpkin soup instead. Talk about why its important to work together and take turns. Talk about the new vocabulary in the book and what it means. For example, slice, stir, chop, row, racket and rumpus!





Make Pumpkin Soup

You will need:

- 1 small pumpkin
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 4 cups chicken or vegetable broth
- 1/2 cup heavy cream

Step by step:

- Cook the pumpkin in the oven.
- Scoop the roasted pumpkin flesh out.
- Add the butter, garlic, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, and pepper.
- Blend the mixture until smooth.
- Add the broth and cream.

Raising Awareness On PANS/PANDAS!

It's PANS/PANDAS Awareness month and an opportunity to enhance understanding of post-infectious medical neuro-psychiatric conditions. PANS and PANDAS are rare paediatric disorders that cause inflammation in the brain and can have a significant impact on a child's life. Following the onset of PANS or PANDAS, children and young people may unexpectedly present with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).
